THE PLASTIC WASTE PROBLEM

AS A REMINDER, HERE ARE A FEW OF THE KEY FACTS YOU'VE BEEN LEARNING ABOUT.

- More than half of the rubbish that ends up in the dustbin could be recycled.
- Around 45% of households in the UK recycle every week.
- In the UK we throw away 455 tonnes of plastic bottles every year. That's around 9.1 billion bottles.
- Every minute, one rubbish truck worth of plastic is dumped into the ocean.
- By 2050 there will be more plastic in the oceans than fish.
- Over 100,000 marine animals die every year after swallowing or getting tangled up in plastic.



We need to **reduce the amount of plastic** we use.

We need to **reuse plastic objects** more.

We need to **recycle more plastic**.

Once you've come up with an idea, it's time to get creative!

HOW TO ENTER

1. Creating your entry

Design a poster to tell people about the plastic waste problem. You should:

- include information on the problem and how people can tackle it. Be creative!
- include a slogan to inspire people to take action

2. Submitting your entry

- Make sure all your details are filled out
- Don't forget to ask your parents to sign the form.
- Hand in your completed design to your teacher

PRIZES AND JUDGING

Posters will be judged by a panel of experts on how well they tell people about the issue and what they can do to tackle it.

26 regions are involved. There will be 1 winner from each region, who will each receive a £100 Asda Gift Card. What's more, 3 national winners will be picked from these 26 winners for overall 1st 2nd and 3rd place!

National winners will win:

1st prize: an Asda Gift Card worth £1,000 and £20,000 for their school*;

2nd prize: an Asda Gift Card worth £500 and £10,000 for their school*;
