Dear Parent/Carer,

In class we have been learning about how we can turn plastic bottle tops into amazing new and exciting things, to help reduce the impact plastic waste has on our wonderful wildlife. We have met animals in peril and learnt about how innovative companies like Composite Prime are finding ground-breaking and creative ways to use waste plastic to make new, exciting products; reducing the amount of plastic waste entering natural ecosystems along the way. Composite Prime creates sustainable composite decking and cladding for the home by converting recycled plastic materials into its products. Each square metre of composite decking contains the equivalent of more than 3,000 plastic bottle caps or 280 plastic bottles. In the seven years of operation the brand has saved the equivalent of 176 million plastic milk bottles from landfill and over 1.8 billion bottle top caps. Top home challenge

Challenge 1: Bottle Top Bonanza

Collect as many plastic bottle tops as you can and keep them all together in one place. You might have a box or bag you could store them in. How many bottle tops did you find around the home?

Challenge 2: Your Message in a Bottle Top

Tell your adult about the animal you chose in class that will feature in your art. Why have you chosen it? Can you explain to your adult what some companies are doing to recycle plastic waste and help the environment?



Challenge 3: This Animal Needs Our Help!

Do some research on your chosen animal. Where does it live? What does it eat? How is plastic waste affecting it? You can record your research in the form of a poster, an information booklet, a newspaper article or a report.

Find out about how you recycle plastics at home. How do you decide which plastics you can recycle, and do you have to sort your plastics separately from other recycling?
