

# EVERYDAY HEROES CELEBRATION GUIDE

## SHARING YOUR PUPILS' HEROIC ACHIEVEMENTS

Here are two fun and engaging ways you could celebrate pupils' learning with the rest of the school community.



### 1. Host your own assembly and spread the heroic message.

Bring the school community together for a powerful celebration assembly. Here's how:

- Pupils dress as their favourite heroes.
- Pupils share lesson highlights, defining and displaying heroic qualities (bravery, compassion, reliability, helpfulness, determination).
- Sing 'Go the Distance' from Disney's *Hercules*, using provided lyrics and backing track.
- Showcase hero shout-outs: a slideshow of pupils' poster entries with volunteers sharing their hero choices.
- Pupils share their Hero Mission Log experiences and how they felt about the challenges.
- End with an inspiring call-to-action for the rest of the school community. Each pupil writes a thank you note to a school hero (friend, teacher, or staff member) to be collected in a Hero Box and distributed later.

### 2. Create an interactive Everyday Hero school display

Find space to inspire the whole school with the positive values pupils learned. Here's what you could add to your display:

- Selection of printouts of pupils' poster entries. Just remember to take a photo of these before sending them off to us!
- Pupils' Heroic Action pledges: promises of how they will be everyday heroes.
- Hero spotlight: a daily or weekly highlight from pupils' Mission Log to celebrate their challenges.
- Thought prompts to spark reflection about what it means to be a hero.  
"What makes a hero?" "Who is your personal hero?"  
"How are you a hero?" "What is an everyday hero?"  
"What special qualities do heroes have?"
- Definitions for each special quality: bravery, compassion, reliability, helpfulness and determination. Include pictures of characters from Hercules. For example, Meg next to the word compassion.
